Perkins/CTE Federal Issues

Perkins V

While Michael Brustein has disseminated a Senate Draft of Perkins V in his recent trainings (that is very close to the House Draft), ACTE Reports there have been new internal conversations among education committee staff, and language and ideas are being exchanged to prompt discussion. These initial ideas are not formal bills or proposals, but a starting point and just one part of the negotiations before action is taken.

Perkins IV Payments 2017-18

First and Second YTD Quarterly payment for Title I-C and CTE Transitions were paid to all districts on March 28, 2018. However Title I-B payments are currently being processed due to Fi\$cal.

Perkins IV Allocations 2018-19

California has just received the allocations for 2018-19 this week and so the Chancellor's Office and the California Department of Education are now determining the split. So hopefully the application will be opened next week for data entry.

Quarterly Reporting – Every quarter districts are required to report and certify their Perkins [Title I-C](#), [CTE Transitions](#), and [Title I-B](#) expenditures in the Year-To-Date Expenditures and Progress Report online system. The reporting schedule ensures that districts are reimbursed in a timely manner. The following reporting dates will apply for FY 2017-18.

DSN Extensions

Deputy Sector Navigator (DSN) Extensions: The Chancellor's Office is providing a 4-month extension starting July 1, 2018 through October 31, 2018. This augmentation will be processed through two different funding sources. All DSNs should have received paperwork for these extensions at the beginning of April.

1. July 1, 2018 – August 31, 2018 (a two-month extension) will be processed through the Chancellors Office in the amount of \$35,000. All expenditures must be reported in the online system in order to complete the final report, which must be submitted 30 days after the new end date of August 31, 2018.

2. September 1, 2018 – October 31, 2018 (a two-month extension) will be processed through the Fiscal Agent in the amount of \$35,000. All expenditures must be reported to the Fiscal Agent 30 days after the new end date of October 31, 2018.

Other

Eloy Ortiz Oakley, Chancellor: This week, the Chancellor’s Office is launching a brand standardization project aimed at strengthening the visual identity of the California Community Colleges and reducing brand clutter and confusion that has accumulated over the years. Central to the brand improvement project is a refreshed system logo that holds up better in certain display treatments, including mobile devices. This will serve as an anchor to a new brand architecture that will more clearly and consistently communicate the work of the Chancellor’s Office in visual displays. In a survey of nearly 700 professionals from the field and our agency, a majority of people expressed a desire for a more disciplined brand structure.
